For the last 35 years, this landmark has housed exhibits, archives, research services, and programs that connect people of all ages to the stories of our region. To ensure this legacy continues, we are launching a \$1 million capital campaign to reinvigorate this incomparable structure and pay respectful tribute to its past.

After serving as a hub of community activity for over 60 years, the 1921 Armory was listed on the National Register of Historic Places and would soon be listed on the State Register of Historic Places. One year later, a new armory was dedicated and the National Guard moved out.






The 1921 Armory needed a new tenant and the Oconomowoc Historical Society needed a new home. The City of Oconomowoc deeded the building to the historical society with the stipulation that a museum be opened within five years.


To ensure that the shared legacies of the 1921 Armory and the Oconomowoc Historical Society continue for decades to come, we are launching this capital campaign to complete a series of renovations and enhancements to our museum building. These updates will protect the building's structure, improve accessibility and visitor experience, and enhance our ability to preserve and share local history.



Time and Wisconsin's weather have taken their toll on the museum's exterior. This project will include patching, repairing, and repainting the building's exterior. These improvements will protect the structure from further damage and preserve its historic appearance.

Exterior work also includes re-installing windows at the building's front elevation by removing outdated knock-out panels, drywall, and framing. This will harken back to the building's first 60 years of existence when there were actual windows! The windows in the exhibit hall will remain covered to protect our artifacts from the damaging effects of sunlight.

Refresh the entrance and other public areas




We will completely reconstruct the outdated restrooms and revitalize the entrance hallway to create a welcoming and accessible experience for our guests and volunteers. Restroom reconstruction will result in an expansion of the Hilbert Scherffius Research Center allowing us to better serve researchers, museum programming, community meetings, and rentals.



The Hilbert Scherffius Research Center




Passage from entryway to exhibit hall





We will install a new, modern lighting in all of our exhibit spaces to create a brighter and more energy-efficient exhibit environment. In addition, the building's ductwork will be professionally cleaned and inspected.



The museum's theatre is a beloved and vital component of our programming. New seating and an enhanced audiovisual system will dramatically improve audience comfort for lectures, films, and school field trips. It will also serve as a gathering place for private and corporate events, extending its impact beyond museum programs and providing an important source of income to support for our mission.
